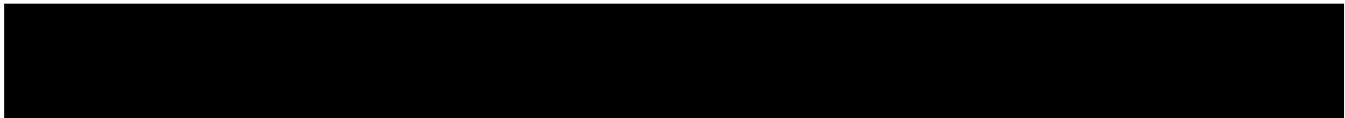

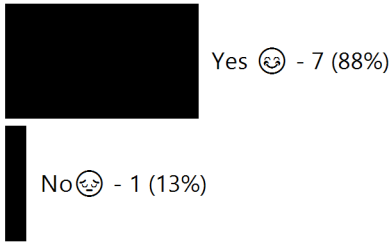




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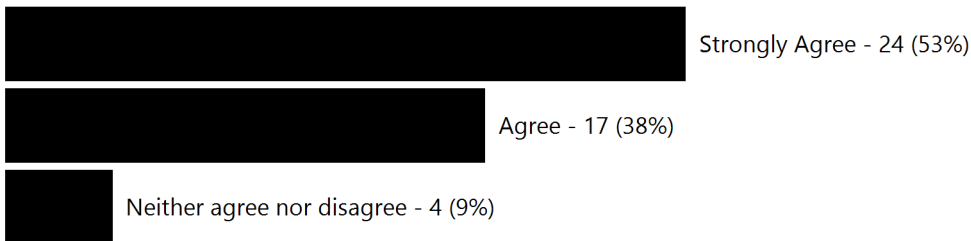
Q10. Did you feel your child was well supported during their period of isolation?

Q14. Does your child have access to a device such as a tablet or laptop to access aspects of home learning?

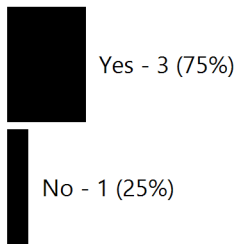


Q15. Have you informed us that your child would not be able to access remote learning?



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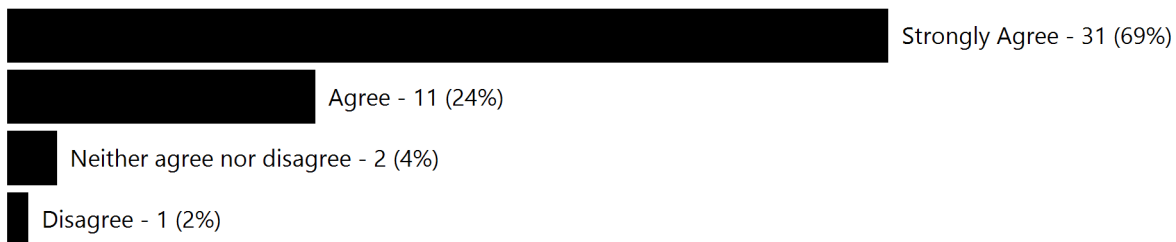
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Q16. Do you feel your child's mental well being was supported as they phased back into school after lockdown?
