The school will aim to:

- ◆ Ensure all children achieve the best that they can with high expectations of all.
- ◆ Aid pupils to develop their mental health and wellbeing.
- ◆ Use emotional intelligence to create and sustain stable and lasting relationships.
- ◆ Give children a breadth of experiences, knowledge and understanding of the possibilities that are available to them in the world and enjoy life.

The family will aim to:

- ◆ Ensure their child attends regularly and is brought into and collected from school on time.
- ◆ Nursery - AM 8:45 – 11:45 PM 12:14– 15:15
- ◆ School – 08:45 – 15:15
- ◆ Inform the school of any concerns or problems that might affect their child.
- ◆ Contact the school first thing in the morning to explain any absences.
- ◆ Support the school's behaviour and co-operation policy.
- ◆ Support home learning activities.
- ◆ Attend Parent's evening/ discussions about their child/children.
- ◆ Monitor their child's use of the internet and social networking sites, ensuring their child adhere to the age restrictions and advice given on e- safety.
- ◆ Ensure their child is dressed appropriately for school, adhering to the uniform policy, including the correct shoes (no trainers), PE kits and jewellery (only a pair of stud earrings);
- ◆ Encourage mutual respect between pupils and all staff by modelling positive behaviours and language at all times.

Together we will aim to:

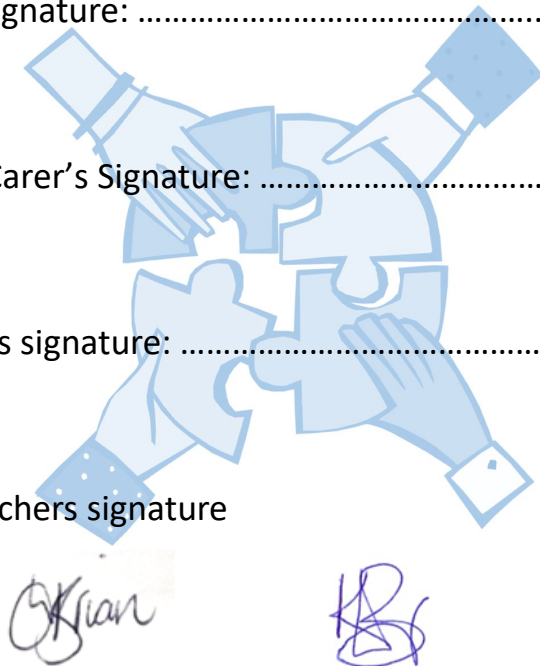

All visitors are expected to treat staff and children in a respectful way when on any of our sites. Any threatening, abusive or violent behaviour against any staff member or child is taken extremely seriously.

Examples of such behaviour are below:

- Shouting at staff
- Raised voices
- Swearing
- Intimidating staff
- Rallying other parents to become involved in intimidating behaviour
- Publically voicing unsubstantiated claims about staff, children or the Academy.
- Using racist or sexist terms
- Using violence
- Using alcohol or drugs on the premises
- Wilful damage to school property
- Theft
- Threats or threatening behaviour

This list is not an exhaustive list but seeks to provide illustrations of such behaviour that is not acceptable in our school.

Anyone behaving this way will be asked to leave the premises and the Police will be called if verbal or physical harassment occurs. If necessary action will be taken to ban anyone behaving such a way from the school grounds.



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
