

This grid outlines the knowledge and skills that Year 4 children will gain throughout this term.

As readers we will:

Continue to develop our skills in language understanding and retrieval of information. We will also increase our focus on inference skills. We will read an exciting range of books to inspire and motivate us as readers as well as gaining exposure to inspire us in our own writing.



As mathematicians we will:

Begin by revising place value, introducing the teachings of rounding and negative numbers. The term will progress with the teachings of the four operations alongside formal written methods. We use these operations to solidify our times table knowledge, consistently practicing for our times table check in June. We also expand our knowledge of number by learning about fractions and decimals.



As writers we will:

Be continuing to use Linked English as our approach to develop our children as readers, writers, speakers and listeners. Furthermore, the programme enables children to read and write independently for a range of purposes and for a variety of audiences. Through Linked English, pupils will develop their writing skills through unpicking how authors use specific skills, practicing these skills such as using fronted adverbials, subordination and similes in writing, and learning how to edit and improve our work. We will be writing our own myths, non-fiction factfiles of our own mythical creatures, a natural disaster story and a Roman soldier handbook.

As scientists we will:

Building on our knowledge from classifying animals to explore their habitats and the effect humans have on habitats, we will then investigate all about sound from how sound travels to how we hear and we explore what affects pitch and volume.



As historians we will:

- Build on our knowledge of ancient civilisations by exploring Ancient Roman life and the rise and fall of the empire.
- Analyse how Rome was ruled compared with other ancient and modern civilisations, and how the role of democracy varied during the Roman Empire compared to Britain today.



As geographers we will:

- Use geographical tools and vocabulary to locate places on a map.
- Describe change over time in climate in a specific location.
- Begin to develop skills for the understanding of conflicts in different parts of the world.



As artists and designers, we will:

- Develop our techniques and control using a range of materials in different kinds of art. E.g. art, craft and design.
- Use the different elements of art to create a final piece inspired by famous artists.

In computing we will:

- Develop our coding skills to create shapes and repeating shapes to form a patterns.
- Programme technology like micro bits to collect and log data from around our school.



In Spanish we will:

- Spring 1: Learning to say, read and understand the vocabulary for items served in a Spanish cafe.
- Spring 2: Learning to say, read and understand the vocabulary for items of equipment used in a school.



In RE we will:

- Explore different religions.
- Identify key beliefs, celebrations, rituals, and holy buildings.
- Identify the origin of Jesus.



In PSHE we will:

- Focus on how to keep ourselves safe online and in our relationships.
- Look at different friendships, relationships and peer pressure and our dreams and goals
- Introduction to how our bodies change as we get older and the effects of alcohol, e-cigarettes and tobacco on our bodies.



As musicians we will:

- Explore how to create different sounds by different sizes of people's voices
- Learn what an ostinato is and perform the song.
- Perform a song from around the world.



In PE we will:

- Continue to develop our swimming ability and safety in water
- Learn about invasion games, how to find space and become more confident catching and throwing.
